- 23) The quoted lines have been taken from 'The Narayanpur Incident' by Shashi Deshpande. The speaker, sub-inspector Patil, was Mohan's father's school friend. As a well-wisher, he had come to warn Mohan and his family about a police raid at their house. These were the turbulent times of the Quit India movement and the police suspected that Mohan, a young freedom fighter hid a cyclostyling machine to produce copies of Mahatma Gandhi's speech. When Mohan's mother agreed to hand over the cyclostyling machine to the sub-inspector, Mohan protested. This was when sub-inspector Patil assured him that the country was as much his as it was Mohan's.
