6	Sharma Brothers inherited some ancestral property. They decided to form a Hindu Undivided Family (HUF) consisting of four male members and invested the ancestral property into the business. The family is headed by Mr. Sunil Sharma; hence he is regarded as the Karta. He is the one who takes all the decisions and manages the business. The business took a loan of Rs. 10 lakh from Punjab National Bank which was to be returned within three years. Due to poor financial position of the business, they were unable to repay the loan. The bank filed a suit for the recovery of loan. Mr. Sunil Sharma pleaded to the court that as the entire loan was taken for the purpose of business, all members of the business were liable for the repayment of the loan. The court held that all the members except Karta were also responsible but only to the extent of their share of co parcenery property of business. However, Mr. Sunil Sharma being Karta of the HUF held an unlimited liability. Hence, he had to pay the balance amount even if it had to be from his personal property.
